IBM Alumni who have recently passed away:

<u>Marjorie Baier</u> died November 21, 2023. Marjorie taught in Chatfield Public Schools for 34 years, then fulfilled a life-long dream of becoming a nurse with an Associate Degree in Nursing. She was active in her church and a member of many 'retired educator' associations. She was an avid reader, loved to travel, and enjoyed social times with friends and family. Marjorie became an Alumni Club member when her husband George died. She is survived by her son, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren.
